Usually you would come to visit us around this time and go around the classes and do some interesting lessons.


This year we are going to do this virtually.

Learning Intention


To create an acrostic poem using the letters of your name that describes you as a person.

Instructions

1. Start off by writing your name vertically, taking a new line for each letter and placing them one under the other.



2. For each letter of your name, see if you can write a word, phrase or short sentence that begins with that letter. It should describe something about you as a person.




TRANSITION TASK - PUZZLING PROBLEMS!


Below are a selection of Mathematical puzzles to exercise those brains and improve your Mathematical strength and agility:





In the pyramid shown the value in a square is the sum of the two numbers directly beneath it. Can you complete the pyramid?




The sum of each row, column and diagonal in this magic square is 50. Can you fill in the missing numbers?







MATERIALS

• White paper, pencil, felt pens or crayons if you have them

DIRECTIONS

- 1. Draw a VERY simple profile head, with or without a hat, with simple neck and shoulders. See the Line Drawing samples.
- 2. About 3 or 4 lines are added to split up the face.
- 3. The sections in the face are filled in with words of your favourites: activities, food, hobbies. The words need to be capitals. Creatively FILL each section using pattern in some areas if you want to.
- 4. After you have completed that, you can colour it using coloured pens, crayons, or pencils. Or you can decorate it using black and white patterns.



Draw out your idea first in pencil then go over it in pen.

You can make your words standout by adding pattern.

If you have coloured pencil or pens you can use colour.

BECS


Welcome to BECS (Business Education and Computer Science). This is where you learn about the world of Computers, how to code, use software as-well as the world of business.


You are going to learn to code:

1.

Open up a web browser (Chrome, explorer, Firefox) and search for "Hour of code"



2. Once you are on the sight it will have activities.

This is what the coding challenges look like. Once complete you will get to print a certificate if you want or save it and print it when you get to Turnbull.

Welcome to Science at Turnbull High School ©

The study of Science uses experiments to describe and explain everything around us.

Design and test a rocket

Equipment: Paper Template, sellotape, scissors, a straw.

If you do not have a straw use the plastic outside of an old pen or make a tube from a roll of paper.

Safety: Be careful using the scissors. Ask for help if needed. Do not leave lying around.

Design your rocket

Tip: Cut some strips of sellotape before you start and have them stuck to the edge of your table.

- 1. Cut out shapes A, B and C from the paper template using the scissors.
- 2. Make the body of your rocket.
 - Roll shape A around the straw to make a cylinder. Stick together with sellotape.
 - Place sellotape over one end of the cylinder. Try to make it so that air blown from the other end does not pass through.
- 3. Make the nose cone of the rocket.
 - Take shape B and make into a cone (*tricky!*). Use sellotape to keep the shape.
 - Make a piece of sellotape double-sided by folding over and stick inside the cone.
 - Place the cone over the end of the cylinder (A) that is covered with sellotape.
- 4. Add the wings.
 - Take shape C and put double-sided tape along the middle
 - Stick the cylinder along this. Colour and decorate if you wish.

Launch procedure

- Place your rocket over the straw (or similar).
- Blow through the straw to launch rocket.

Experiment: How far can the rocket travel?

Equipment: Rocket, a measuring tape. If you do not have a measuring tape, count the number of footsteps from launch site to landing.

Safety: Do not launch rocket towards people and pets.

Procedure: Find a safe indoor or outdoor space with enough room and no obstacles.


Mark your launch site. Launch rocket. Measure the distance the rocket has travelled. Repeat 3 times.


We're looking forward to seeing you next term in Home Economics where we'll spend our time together learning more about what foods are good for keeping us healthy and strong!
