

# BUILDING LEARNING POWER

We have been very busy developing our whole school approach to Learning and Teaching. We have had a focus on Principle 2: Building Shared Responsibility which encourages our young people to contribute more to the lesson structure and content.

Our numbers are increasing as we now have 28 BLP Ambassadors from S4, S5 and S6 who are working together to develop ways to promote understanding about the Building Shared Responsibility icons.

Our ambassadors have met and discussed the different icons which represent different strategies as demonstrated on the poster below:



Our ambassadors have been very creative and discussed different ways of disseminating this information to pupils in the BGE: S1, S2 and S3. Their first initiative was to put together a PowerPoint and present this to all year groups with the purpose of enabling all pupils to gain an understanding of Building Shared Responsibility. Following this, they planned and developed a lesson insert which they taught to all pupils across the BGE to give them the opportunity to see and experience the strategies within the lesson. # respectme: Scotland's National Anti-Bullying Service Turnbull High School Youth Action Group

In March 2022, we offered out the opportunity to become young ambassadors for respect*me*. Young people from S2 and S6 applied to join Respect*me*'s Youth Action Group. With a limited number of places available, four of the candidates who applied from the school were successful. In their role as members of the Youth Action Group, Kieran, Theodocia, Temilade and Precious codesigned the national campaign and committed to two years of working with respect*me*. As young people motivated by the fairness and justice, their focus soon became on rights of young people should they experience bullying behaviour.

The Listen Up! (Respect our Rights) Campaign therefore become the theme of this year's national anti-bullying campaign. This was created with input from all nine of the young people from respectme's Youth Action Group. Our young people want every child and young person to be heard and taken seriously when bullying is reported. They agreed that children's rights need to be respected and placed at the heart of all effective responses to bullying behaviour.



Our young ambassadors attended the Scottish Parliament during Anti-Bullying Week to receive their awards from Shirley-Anne Somerville, Cabinet Secretary of Education and Skills.

Although the weather was terrible, the group enjoyed their trip. They managed to squeeze a quick lunch and a visit to the National Gallery of Scotland where they spotted some original art work which they had studied in National 5 Art. Congratulations to our wonderful young people! To have their collaboration and hard work celebrated in such a way is very fitting.

S2 Modern Studies pupils created a story board for a TikTok that would share details of a cause they cared deeply about and wanted change for.

S3 Modern Studies pupils researched party policies and created a variety of posters and leaflets to inform the whole school in preparation for a whole school election on Friday 18.11.22.

S4 History and Modern Studies pupils enjoyed a visit from former pupil, and Glasgow Region MSP, who shared his journey from pupil to politics and some of the work he is doing in Parliament which sparked great interest amongst all learners.

On Friday 18<sup>th</sup> November, Higher Modern Studies pupils were

treated to a visit from MSP Rona McKay who gave an insight into her work in parliament and shared some knowledge of the workings of politics that will be of use to pupils in their upcoming prelims!

The week was finished off with the results of our whole school election. 290 members of our school community turned out to vote at the impressive polling station created by our Modern Studies Captaincy Team of Becca G, Lucy MacF and Grace L with the SNP winning with 41% of the vote.

# S1 Trip to the Bannockburn Experience

As part of their learning on the Scottish Wars of Independence, S1 visited the Bannockburn Experience. The young people learned about the events of this epic two-day confrontation between the Scottish and English armies through an immersive digital experience, object handling workshop and outdoor tour.

Pupils visited the Battle Room where they took part in an interactive activity over a military style battle map. This activity enhanced their knowledge and understanding of the events of the battle as well as the tactics used by Robert the Bruce.



Once the pupils had learned what happened in the battle itself, they visited the main exhibition room where they saw battle scenes. They learned about the different soldier types, their purposes and how they fought each other.



Pupils also had to opportunity to explore replica weapons and armour from the time of battle.

The Outdoor Tour helped S1 to learn more about why the surrounding landscape was significant to the battle, how the soldiers must have felt during the confrontation and to see how we commemorate the battle today.

This live history lesson was very well received as you can see by the photographs. This was especially so when our young historians uncovered a Geographer!

# **Investigating Vision**

S3 Physics pupils had a visit from Dr Andrew Logan, BSc PhD FHEA MCOptom DipTp (IP). Andrew is a former pupil of Turnbull High School and now a Senior Lecturer in Vision Sciences at Caledonian University.

Andrew very kindly met with S3 Physics pupils, as well as interested S1 pupils and finished off his visit by chatting with our Advanced Higher Physics about University experiences, applications and advice on career options.

The S3 session was designed to extend Level 4/National 5 Physics ideas on light reflection and refraction into the applications of sight, eye defects and solutions such as glasses, contact lenses and laser eye surgery. Some pupils even got a free eye test – thanks Dr Logan!

Andrew then conducted a lunchtime "Café Sci" session with interested S1 and S2 pupils on Optical illusions.









# Primary 6 Science Experiments









We loved inviting Primary 6 pupils back to Science for some fun experiments. It is the first time we have been able to do this for a few years and we were as excited as the pupils to get the Bunsen burners fired up!

Primary 6 pupils from St Helens, St Matthews and St Nicholas engaged in the activities.

Pupils completed six experiments, writing down observations and results. At the end a class discussion on results and possible explanations for the results were discussed.

# **S1 Windfarm Trip**



All the S1 classes are in the process of visiting one of Europe's biggest windfarm's which is south of Glasgow. SSE's Whitelee Windfarm has 215 turbines which produce enough electricity to power over 350,000 homes.

The pupils saw just how big the turbines are, learnt about the design and the process of selling the electricity to the National Grid. We travelled on a fully electric bus round the site and learned about the plans to build electricity storage so they can make better use of the wind when there is less demand for power.

Each group took part in an interactive workshop lead by the Science Centre where they investigated the effect of blade shape on the electricity produced. This is all part of our learning about Sustainability and Energy production and contributes to our Sustainable Development Passport award.

Linking in with our Windfarm visit S1 had a visiting STEM Ambassador come and share the world of work with them. Harriet Kelly battled with a rogue fire alarm to share her work as a financial modeller for Ventient Energy. She studied Engineering but discovered she really enjoyed finance and has managed to combine her skills with her passion for sustainability now working for an Windfarm company.

Linking our learning to the world of work opens up pathways beyond school and we hope inspires our community that they can enact change. Future Energy solutions require innovative ideas which pupils have been researching and creating solutions such as a Rain Water Generator or a net zero house.

Ventient Energy is a company that aims to be carbon neutral and sustainability is at the heart of all it does. Everything Ventient does is designed to maximise the efficiency of our wind energy assets. Generating the world's cleanest energy is beneficial for the future of all society and the planet. Our S1's will continue looking at these issues as they learn about Heat Energy and how our action affect the melting of the poles and encouraging us to take responsibility for our actions.
