Head Teacher Report

October 2022

School Matters

- S4-S6 Prelims will run throughout December. All students will be provided with a prelim timetable by the end of this month. A copy of the prelim timetable will also be available on the school website. Supported Study classes start on Monday 7th November.
- Option Choice Programme / Timetable 2023-2024. Straw polls regarding pupil choice of subjects will take place with all year groups S2-S5 on Thursday 17th November. Students in S2 have been given an initial free choice in the last two columns this will ensure their BGE entitlement to a breadth of study across all curriculum areas whilst providing some element of choice. Students in S3-S5 are being given a free choice in the initial straw poll (English and Maths compulsory up to S4). The information gathered from the straw polls will be used to inform column structures and workforce planning.

A series of Parent Information Evenings will be taking place in the coming months. All pupils will be further supported in PSE and through 1-1 interviews with their PT Pupil Support, where requested. The SDS Advisers are also available for 1-1 interviews in relation to careers. These are available on request through the PT Pupil Support.

- As part of our quality assurance programme and school improvement planning, SMT and staff across all departments are engaging in learning visits throughout October.
 Pupil BLP ambassadors will also be leading pupil assemblies to discuss our current learning and teaching focus – SHARED RESPONSIBILITY.
- This session we will be consulting with all our stakeholders on the review of our school vision, values and aims. This is an important process that takes place every 5-6 years to ensure all members of our school community have a shared ownership and understanding of our mission as a Catholic school. The review of our vision statement is currently underway and we will focus on our school values during a

whole school consultation conference that will form part of our patronal feast day events.

• National Discussion on Education: The Scottish Government has launched a new national discussion on education, one which will give everyone the chance to have their voice heard. They are inviting everyone who has an interest in the future of our education system: children and young people, parents and carers, practitioners, and those in the wider Scottish community to pause, to reflect and to contribute to a future vision for Scottish education. - Ms Brown has resigned her maternity cover in the maths department to take up a permanent contract with GCC. We thank Ms Brown for her time with us and wish her well in her new post.

<u>Spiritual</u>

- A weekly prayer service continues to take place in our school Oratory every Friday lunchtime with Canon Hill celebrating First Friday Mass each month.
- CREDO This group takes place on Tuesday lunchtimes in RE department and includes all of our regular faith-in-action activities in the school. It is led by our S6 Caritas pupils and gives pupils an opportunity to plan and lead our spiritual and charitable events throughout the year.
- Our First Year Welcome Mass took place in Wednesday 14th September. We were delighted to have this opportunity to come together as a community of faith and thank Father Monaghan for celebrating Holy Mass with our new S1 pupils and their parents and families.
- Our S1 pupils have also participated in our S1 retreat programme. Following on from receiving the Sacrament of Confirmation, this retreat takes our young people through to a more mature discipleship informed by the gifts of the Holy Spirit.
- A group of 21 pupils from our CREDO group attended the annual Aid to the Church in Need Rally on the 21st of September.

- A group of 16 CREDO pupils represented Turnbull High School at a Water Liturgy at the invitation of the Archdiocese of Glasgow. This special event was held at Carfin Grotto on Tuesday 27th September. The Relics of St Bernadette were also present and pupils had the opportunity to venerate.
- S2 pupils have participated in Rosary workshops offered by the Archdiocese Arts Project. Our young people learned about the Mysteries of the Holy Rosary in a practical way, with each pupil receiving a set of rosary beads at the end of the workshop to encourage them to pray the rosary at home or in school.
- Plans are underway for the celebration of our Patronal Feast Day on Monday 21st November.

School Events

- Our S1 Fresher's Fayre took place on 26th August. S1 pupils took time to find out about the wide range of the clubs and activities on offer before making their final choices – all pupils are expected to sign up for five lunchtime or after school activities.
- Careers Event 31st August –we were delighted to welcome pupils, parents and providers into the school for our first Careers Event since 2019. The evening was a resounding success: attendance was excellent and the initial feedback from parents and providers was very positive.
- S4 Geography pupils visited Loch Lomond on Wednesday 7th September as part of their National 5 course.
- On 15th September, S1 History students embarked on an educational visit to the Battle of Bannockburn site.
- The S2 Study Skills Day took place on Friday 16th September.
- A series of Live'n'Learn conferences have taken place for S1 (resilience/drive) and S4 (study skills).
- Our celebration of European Day of Languages kicked off on 28th September with our annual S1 treasure hunt and continued all week with all classes: S2 - European Quiz, S3 - European Language Passport, S4 - Guest speakers, S5 - French breakfast, S6 -Languages Escape Room
- Our AH Physics class spent two days at Glasgow University participating in workshops and lectures within the Engineering, Physics and computing departments.
- Geobus: We were delighted to welcome back the Geobus during October. Run by PHD students from St Andrew's University, the geobus staff delivered workshops to Higher, S2 and S3 pupils.
- Maths Week: Pupils from across all stages participated in a range of activities throughout maths week. Activities included: cryptography challenge, maths magic squares and participation in an inter-authority senior pupils maths conference.

- Café-Sci: an occasional lunchtime club exploring Science and STEM issues with invited experts: On Tuesday 4th October, we were delighted to have Dr Logan a university expert on Vision discuss the science behind optical illusions and explore the question "Why do our brains sometimes get confused by what we see?"
- A group of 30 senior students participated in a targeted work experience workshop on 11th October.
- An S3/S4 Spanish cinema trip took place on Wednesday 12th October. The film study will form part of the S3 course media unit and be included in the S4 N5 speaking assessment.
- A group of approximately 20 pupils will be participating in their Duke of Edinburgh qualifier expedition from 24th -26th October.
- Our young sports ambassadors are in the process of organising the annual Active Girls Day that will take place on Thursday 27th October 2022. Active Girls Day is an annual initiative that celebrates the amazing work going into girls' sport, the progress around girls' participation, and the incredible role models making it happen.
- The Science department is planning to take S1 to visit the Whitelee Windfarm across three different days during October/November.
