#### <u>Staff</u>



#### School/Individual Achievements

- EDC DanceFest: As anticipated, Turnbull girls were excellent finishing 2<sup>nd</sup> place overall. Entered into 8 categories every single performance was placed (no other school did this!) with 1x 1<sup>st</sup> place, 6x 2<sup>nd</sup> place and 1x 3<sup>rd</sup> place.
- Kaitlin W was selected to participate in the Scottish Young Musicians Solo Performer Competition 2023. The standard was really high and Kaitlyn performed well in talented company.
- 20 third year pupils have completed their Bronze Duke of Edinburgh Expedition.
- Winners of regional STEM Challenge: A team of S2 pupils (Orla B, Keith C, Patrick D, Lennin D, Amy H, Abel S) represented Turnbull HS at the West of Scotland heat of the Global Underwater STEM Challenge and won it in style! The pupils had to design, build and program a robot to move autonomously along a line and complete a number of challenges. They also had to pitch their product in a dragon's den style competition. They are now looking forward to competing in the Scottish final in Aberdeen in June
- The Scottish final of the Micro Tyco challenge took place on 16<sup>th</sup> May with two groups from Turnbull High School selected to present at the final. Each group selected a United Nations Sustainable Development goal and developed an idea to help tackle the issue. Sean M and Jack W came in the top 6 and Lucy O'C and Cerys M took second place. Lucy and Cerys were asked to film their story to be showcased on the Wildhearts website. This is a superb achievement for both sets of pupils to do so well at this stage of the competition – well done!
