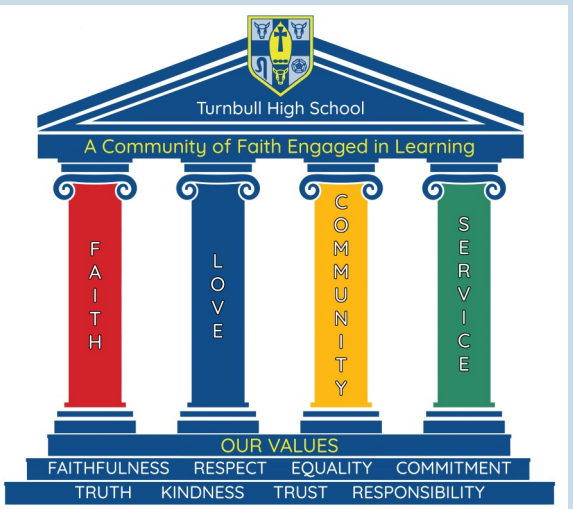
Our Shared Vision
