# **School Uniform Policy**

Our dress code provides a cost-effective way for pupils to show that they are proud to belong to our school community. Our uniform has been agreed in full consultation with the Parent and Pupil Councils. We expect the highest possible uniform standards for all of our pupils from S1 to S6.

Uniform has many advantages in particular it

- Reflects a positive attitude to learning
- Removes peer pressure to wear expensive brand names
- Promotes equality and inclusion for all pupils

All teachers have responsibility for ensuring that uniform standards are checked with classes.

### Procedures

- Any pupil who is not in full uniform should report to the Community Hub when they arrive in school. We will aim to provide pupils with item(s) of uniform required. Where this is not possible, a pink uniform slip will be issued.
- 2. Teachers should ask to see the pink uniform slip if a pupil arrives in class and is not in FULL uniform. If a pupil does not have this they should be recorded as demerit (uniform) on SEEMIS.
- 3. Teachers should ensure that NO outdoor jackets/ tops are worn when pupils are entering or leaving class. These should be kept in pupil lockers.
- 4. Teachers should ensure that blazers are worn when pupils leave class.

# Turnbull Uniform: Dress for Success

### All pupils should arrive in class wearing

- 1. Turnbull school blazer.
- 2. Blue school shirt/ blouse complete with school tie.
- 3. Black, formal school skirt. Dresses, pinafores and tight/ short skirts are not acceptable. Skirts should be an appropriate length.
- 4. Black, formal tailored trousers. All other forms of trouser are not acceptable.
- 5. Black school cardigans or plain black V-neck jumpers.
- 6. Black shoes

### Other information

The wearing of jewellery should be kept to a minimum as it can be a Health and Safety risk. Make up, if worn, should be discreet. Please refer any concerns regarding uniform to SMT.
