# January 2024

### School Matters

- Senior Phase Prelims have been completed and prelim analysis meetings with all departments have been scheduled to take place this month.
- Options Information Evenings have taken place for parents of pupils in S2 and S3. The S4/5 Information Evening will take place on the 16<sup>th</sup> January, parents can attended in person or access via Teams.
- Options interviews for pupils in S2 S5 will take place throughout January and February. Work on the timetable for 2024/25 will then begin.
- S3 SNSA writing assessments have been completed. Reading and numeracy assessments will take place in February and April respectively.
- Stakeholder surveys completed for our HMIe inspection and the inspection report produced will be used to inform our school improvement plan for 2024/25.

The significant food donations received as part of dress down day were used to provide food parcels for the children and families of Chesters Nursery in Drumchapel and local foodbanks. Ten hampers went to the families in Drumchapel and we collected around 50 bags of food. Staff and pupils also provided over 100 Christmas gifts for the children of Chesters Nursery.

In addition, we sponsored ten families from Chester's Nursery with Farmfoods vouchers totaling £1000. This included generous donations from HMS faculty staff and families, the McInespie Foundation (£500) and a very generous donation from a Turnbull parent (£200). Each family was also provided with Christmas gifts and packages of clothing and daily need items by their sponsors.

### School/Individual Achievements

- All BGE pupils meeting the eligibility criteria have been issued with their Aiming High certificates.
- All SP pupils meeting the eligibility criteria for Aiming Higher certificates have received their certificates.
- BeBras UK Computational Thinking Challenge S1 pupils in THS achieved some fantastic results in this competition which attracted 209,768 participants from across the UK. 20 pupils were placed in the top 25% in the UK and received a certificate of distinction, with a further 16 pupils receiving a certificate of Merit for being in the top 50% in the UK.
