LETTER FROM THE HEAD TEACHER

Dear Parent/Carer

Welcome to this edition of the Turnbull Times. I hope you enjoying reading about some of the key happenings across our school community.

Advent Charity Campaign 2025

Our Advent Charity Campaign 2025 was yet another tremendous success with over £1000 raised.

The donations received as part of dress down day were used to provide food parcels for the children and families of Chesters Nursery in Drumchapel and local foodbanks, with over 800 items being donated.

Staff and pupils also provided over 100 Christmas gifts for the children of Chesters Nursery. In addition, we sponsored ten families from Chesters Nursery. Each family was provided with Christmas gifts, clothing and daily need items by their sponsors.

The grand total for our Advent Selection Box Appeal was 263 which is a fantastic amount. Selection boxes were distributed to Chesters Nursery, Drumchapel, St Aloysius Church, Springburn and the foodbank.

Our RE department led a very successful fundraising campaign which provided support to people and families in need:

- Kindness Homeless Street Team: A financial donation of £200 along with food and warm clothes was provided to this team. This small charity services over 200 people per week with clothing, toiletries and food, helping some of the city's most vulnerable people.
- A further £500 was donated to SSVP to support their work in helping families in their local community.
- Financial support was provided to six families in need within our school community.

A huge well done and thank you to everyone for their contribution to this very successful Advent Charity Appeal.

Lenten Activities

During Lent pupils will be asked to reflect on 'A Time for Prayer', 'A Time for Fasting' and 'A Time for Almsgiving' through our weekly themes.

Our 'Daily Decade' continues to takes place in the Oratory every morning with a range of

Our Lenten Charities Campaign will be launched on Ash Wednesday (Wednesday 18th February). All monies raised will support our continuing sponsorship of Chinkholowondyo School in Zambia. Food and Easter Egg donations will be used to support local foodbanks, Chesters Nursery Drumchapel and St Aloysius Parish Springburn.

Uniform

We are very grateful for the support we have received from parents for our school dress code. Uniform plays an important role in setting the tone for learning and also promotes equity within our school community.

Unfortunately, we are currently seeing a decline in the standard of uniform worn by pupils and I am seeking the support of parents to reverse this trend.

There is an increasing trend in relation to the following items of clothing:

- Female pupils wearing cropped jumpers / tank tops.
- Pupils wearing leggings or tracksuit bottoms.
- Pupils wearing footwear that is not plain black.

These are not acceptable items within our school dress code and I would ask for your support in ensuring your son/daughter is complying with our school dress code, details of which can be found inside.

During these winter months, can I also ask that you continue to support the wearing of our school blazer. Blazers can be worn under coats or stored in pupil lockers. During the school day pupils will be expected to wear their

Mid Term Holiday


School will close for the mid-term break on Friday 13th February at 2.55pm and will reopen on Thursday 19th February at 9am.

Our Annual Senior Awards Ceremony took place on Tuesday 23 September 2025. It was a fantastic evening during which the high levels of attainment and wide ranging achievements of so many of our young people were recognised through the awarding of certificates and prizes of our current S5, S6 and 2025 leavers.

The awards were given in several categories including subject attainment (for the pupil who received the highest mark in the final exam), subject achievement (for the pupil in each subject whom the teachers feel did exceedingly well) and wider achievement (for pupils' achievements in extracurricular activities). As well as these there were awards for General Excellence for pupils who received 6+ As at National 5 level and for pupils who received 4+ As at Higher level.

Supporting Children and Young People with Healthcare Needs in Turnbull High

A Very Quick Guide for Parents and Carers

Parents and carers are responsible for supplying information about medication which needs to be taken in school and for letting the school know of any changes to prescribed medication or any health support needed.

The PT Pastoral Care must be the first point of contact for any information relating to a young person's health. Should a young person require to self-administer a medication or require EDC employees to administer a medication, the appropriate forms must be completed and returned.

Forms

Form PM 9/06/F01 –

Parental Request for School Employees to Administer Medication

Form PM 9/06/F02 –

Parental request for Young person to Self-Administer Medication

No medications will be held by the school or administered by employees without the form being completed by parents and carers. EDC employees will not administer any medication unless the paperwork is completed and the medication is appropriately packaged. All medications must be prescribed. In all cases, **each** medication should be clearly labelled with the following information:

- Young person's name
- Date of birth
- Written instructions provided by parents, carers or doctor
- The prescribed dose
- Dose frequency
- Expiry date
- Any additional or cautionary information

It is essential that young people with serious allergies and health conditions carry medication, inhalers and EPIPENS with them at all times. **This includes PE (e.g. when on the pitch), break, lunchtimes, trips and activities out of school. The medication should be not be left in school bags.**

Unwell in School

When responding to pupil illness in school, the school office will contact parents and carers. Parents and carers may deem it appropriate that their child remains in school or is collected from school. It may be the case that pupils and parents communicate directly with each other when the child is feeling unwell. **We respectfully ask that all communication is made through the school office so communication is clear and accurate, allowing us to respond appropriately to parents and carers.**

Pupils are not allowed to go home if under 16 years of age and there is no responsible adult at home or, if over 16, without the parent/carer's knowledge and consent. The school office keeps a record of those pupils reporting sick, nature of illness, time and nature of parental contact and next steps.

Supporting Children and Young People with Healthcare Needs in Turnbull High

Hygiene and Infection Control

Parents should inform the school of their child's absence which relates to any illness which could be infectious and easily passed on. Children with diarrhoea or vomiting should stay away from school until they have not been sick or had diarrhoea for at least 2 days (48 hours). NHS advice can be found here:

Please note that when reporting an absence on the Parent Portal and to the school office, please ensure you give details of the illness. Please do not be offended if we ask for more information if you report your child as being 'unwell'.

Outdoor Activities and Excursions

Require the approval of the Year Group Head or the Head Teacher, if multiple year groups are involved. Planning and risk assessment for outdoor activities and excursions are undertaken through our EVOLVE process, using the appropriate EDC documentation. Transitions

Planning for transitions to and from high school for young people with long term or complex healthcare or medical needs will take the format of a Team around the Child Meeting. This will involve all relevant GIRFEC partners and should begin six months before the anticipated transition point.

United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child

(UNCRC) – all children and young people have rights as set out in the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child. Of particular reference is Article 24: the right to Health all children have a right to the highest attainable standard of health and to health care services that help them attain this. In addition, all children and young people have a right to an education on the basis of equal opportunity and are entitled to support in their learning.

The GIRFEC National practice model also takes the UNCRC rights approach into everyday practice across all agencies concerned with the wellbeing of children and their families. It expects children and families to be fully included in decision-making, as required by UNCRC Article 12.

We aim to support health needs in the least intrusive and most respectful way possible. This is best undertaken by involving young people and parents in planning how medical needs will be met by supporting and encouraging young people to take responsibility for their own health needs.

Electrical Safety Week Scotland

We have put together some safety information for you in connection with Electrical Safety Week Scotland, this year in East and West Dunbartonshire we are focusing on lithium-ion batteries.

Fires caused by lithium-ion batteries have increased. The ferocity of a fire caused by a lithium-ion battery can be significant and prevent you from escaping from your home.

The information attached covers safe use of, lithium ion batteries, which can be found in, vapes, e-scooters and gadgets including mobile phones and is relevant for not only young people but also parents and carers.

ELECTRICAL SAFETY

Many house fires are caused by misusing electricity.

- + Never overload sockets.
- + Don't leave devices on standby – it saves energy and money.
- + Avoid joining extension leads together (aka "daisy-chaining").
- + When out or sleeping, make sure electrical appliances like tumble dryers, washing machines and dishwashers are not running.
- + Follow instructions when using an electric blanket.

LITHIUM-ION BATTERIES

Fires caused by lithium-ion batteries have increased.

They are rechargeable batteries which are found in common items including mobile phones, e-cigarettes and some general household goods. They should always be charged, stored and disposed of responsibly.

TOP TIP!
 Never overcharge a device that has a lithium-ion battery.

- + Never use a damaged charger.
- + Be aware of purchasing cheap, incompatible chargers online.
- + Avoid charging your device while asleep or away from home.
- + Never charge or store a device on top of a bed.
- + A dropped or damaged battery can catch fire and explode.

ELECTRIC MODES OF TRANSPORT

If involved in a fire, electrical modes of transport (i.e. e-bikes or mobility scooters) can release large volumes of smoke and generate significant heat in a very short period.

TOP TIP!
 Only charge when someone is present.

- + Do not charge when sleeping.
- + Don't store or charge within a hall/lobby or escape route.
- + Store in a separate room with a smoke detector.
- + Consider removing battery when not in use.
- + Ensure item receives regular maintenance.

Our dress code aims to provide a cost-effective way for pupils to show that they are proud to belong to our school community. Wearing uniform reflects a positive attitude to learning and removes any peer pressure to wear expensive brand names. Wearing uniform also promotes equality and inclusion. We continue to expect the highest possible standards for our Turnbull school uniform.

BLAZER

The school blazer complete with embroidered badge is compulsory for ALL pupils. There are two styles of blazer available, fitted or traditional design, for both boys and girls.

Plain black jackets, **no logos or colours**, may be worn over the blazer and removed upon arrival at school.

SCHOOL SHIRTS/BLOUSES

Only blue school shirts/ blouses that can be fastened to the top are acceptable. These should be traditional school wear clothing.

PE KIT

Plain T- shirt or Turnbull PE top must be worn with shorts / plain sportswear trousers. Leggings are allowed for girls. Neutral colours are fine it need not be black.

Please take note of the following guidelines for your young person's PE kit:

- **Full Change of Clothing:** Students must bring a full change of top, bottoms, and footwear specifically for PE. This helps maintain hygiene and ensures they are dressed appropriately for class.
- **Tops:** Crop tops, belly tops, or any top that exposes the midriff are not permitted. Students should wear a full-length t-shirt or sports top.
- **Bottoms:** Students should wear appropriate sports shorts, leggings, or tracksuit bottoms. These should be suitable for physical activity and the weather.
- **Footwear:** Proper sports trainers are required for PE. Please ensure your child is wearing footwear that provides adequate support. ****Crocs, sandals, or any open-toed shoes are not appropriate**** for PE activities.
- **Team Colours:** To maintain a neutral and inclusive environment, we ask that students do not wear clothing with football colours or logos from any team.
- **Weather-Appropriate Gear:** On days with wet or cold weather, please provide your child with a waterproof jacket or other appropriate outerwear. This will help them stay dry and comfortable during outdoor activities.'
- **Jewellery:** No Jewellery should be worn during PE, with particular reference to hooped earrings, bracelets and necklaces that are on show as they can be easily damaged, lost or cause harm to the wearer and classmates.

We appreciate that this information is prescriptive. This is to ensure that there is no ambiguity as to what is acceptable with regard to school uniform. The school supplier, Baru, provides a very cost effective package for our school. Uniform may also be purchased from reputable stores, or supermarkets which also provide an appropriate range of school wear. High Street fashion retailers do not provide appropriate Turnbull High school uniform. If you are in any doubt please contact the school before purchasing.

Our Community Hub offers recycled uniform items to support all pupils in wearing full school uniform every day. Pupils should go to the Community Hub between 8.45am and 9am to collect required items - stationery, toiletries etc are also available free of charge.


